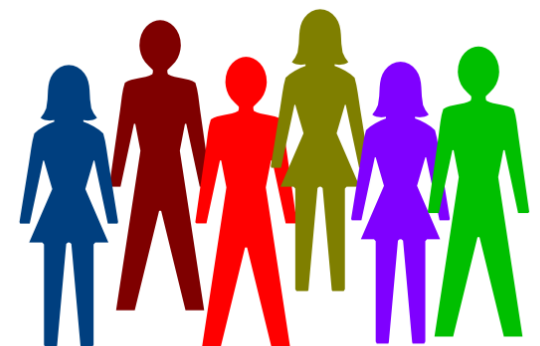

CRITERIA & DUES

- ◆ Members must value diverse communities and possess a commitment to making the Central Pennsylvania Region a welcoming and inclusive place to live, work, learn, and play
- ◆ Eligibility for membership: Potential member must be part of the Central Pennsylvania community. (1) Have diversity and inclusion responsibilities or input in your organization (including equity, retention, employment laws/regulations, education, etc.); (2) Be a college or university student in a field of study related to one or more of the above areas; or, (3) Are a previous member, now retired.
- ◆ Dues: Individuals (including a student) or organization may attend up to one meeting with no commitment in order to gain a better understanding of DIPCPA. A paid membership is required to attend future meetings.
 - Organization (up to 4 individuals) – \$250.00 per year
 - Individual – \$75.00 per year
 - Student – \$25.00 per yearDues are invoiced annually on January 1, and must be paid no later than January 31 of the same calendar year.
- ◆ Adjusted Dues: Individuals/organizations attending the DIPCPA meetings after October 1 of a calendar year will be assessed dues for the next membership year.
